Social Prescribing

- Pilot project started January 2022
- Funded through Social Services Relief Funding
- Over 100 patients seen
- Community Health Centres of Northumberland will be continuing the program



Data Group

- First meeting occurred in March of 2022
- Clear terms of reference and data sharing discussions have occurred
- Ongoing identification of data points available within the community
- SharePoint developed as a means of information sharing and tracking
